



Public Meetings are Being Held to Shape the Future Electoral Map of Yukon

Public meetings are scheduled in communities across the territory to hear Yukoners' views on the interim proposals of the 2017/2018 Electoral District Boundaries Commission.

 - **Carmacks: Tantalus School (Round Room)** from **12:00 pm** to **2:00 pm**
 - **Faro: Recreation Centre (Sportsman's Lounge)** from **5:00 pm** to **7:00 pm**
- **Saturday, March 10, 2018 in**
 - **Ross River: Ross River School (Gathering Room)** from **12:00 pm** to **2:00 pm**
 - **Watson Lake: Recreation Centre (Curling Lounge)** from **5:00 pm** to **7:00 pm**

Commission Chair, Justice Ron Veale, emphasized the importance of public input in shaping the future electoral map. "The Commission needs to hear from communities throughout Yukon to ensure that final proposals for future electoral district boundaries will maintain effective representation for all Yukoners. Everyone is encouraged to review the proposed boundaries and share comments on the interim proposals."

Comments on the proposed boundaries may be shared in writing or in person at a public meeting. Everyone wishing to share their views at a public meeting is invited to contact the Commission's office by March 1, 2018 to be added to the list of presenters.

All public input received by March 10, 2018 will be considered by the Commission in preparing its final recommendations, which will be submitted to the Legislative Assembly by April 20, 2018.

The Commission sincerely thanks all those who participated in the public meetings held in February. A number of presentations were made, providing valuable information that will assist the Commission in developing its final proposals.
